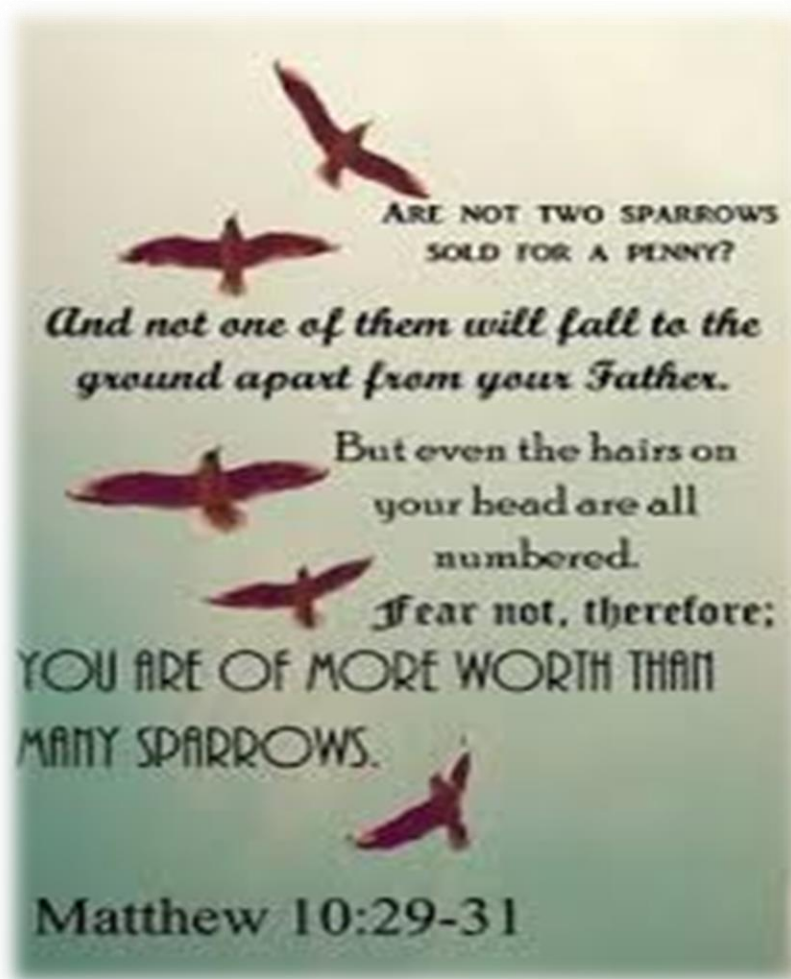

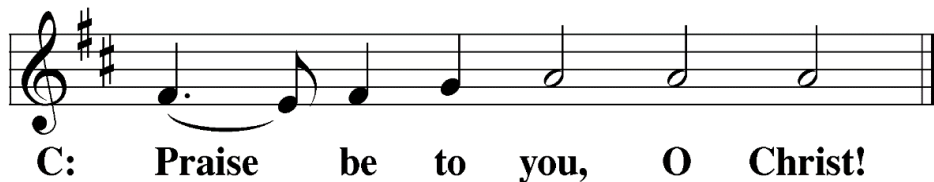

Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell.²⁹ Are not two sparrows sold for a penny?
