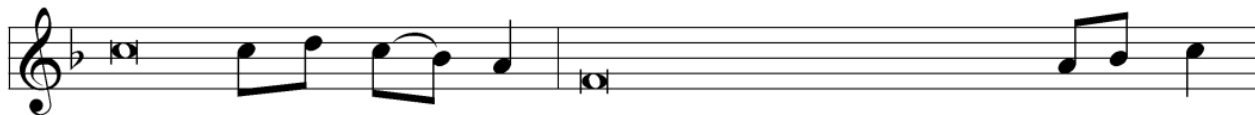

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON: Acts 4:23-33


