

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: Beloved in the Lord: let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.
- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

LORD, HAVE MERCY (Kyrie)

FIRST LESSON: Acts 4:8-12

⁸ Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, ⁹ if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, by what means this man has been healed, ¹⁰ let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by him this man is standing before you well.

¹¹ This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. ¹² And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

SECOND LESSON: 1 John 1:1 – 2:2

1 That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life— ² the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us— ³ that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that

you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. ⁴ And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

⁵ This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. ⁷ But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. ⁸ If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰ If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

2 My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. ² He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

GOSPEL: Luke 24:36-49

³⁶ As they were talking about these things, Jesus himself stood among them, and said to them, "Peace to you!" ³⁷ But they were startled and frightened and thought they saw a spirit. ³⁸ And he said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹ See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me, and see. For a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰ And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹ And while they still disbelieved for joy and were marveling, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate before them.

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high."

We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life (+) of the world to come. Amen.




Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; this is the new testament





ROOTS MONTESSORI As announced after church on Sunday, April 8th, St. Peter's is in discussions with a group that wants to establish a Montessori school using a portion of our facility. The name of their school will be Roots Montessori. Representatives from the Church Council, Board of Trustees, the Board of Education/Stewardship and pastor met with the group leaders and the following highlights reflect key aspects of the discussion:

- 1. Roots Montessori do not plan to include pre-school in their program but would rather partner with existing pre-schools in the area, including ours, to set up a feeder source for their school. They will initially focus on grade 1-6 but would like to expand to higher grades at some point.
- 2. They would like to lease three (3) classrooms from us and share the gym as appropriate.
- 3. Although specific numbers were not discussed, we did discuss various aspects of the lease (term, maintenance, utilities, improvements) and it was made clear they are willing to work with St. Peter's in a reasonable fashion.
- 4. The curriculum they plan to use will include Christian-based values teaching and Pastor Schaefer was able to ask them questions and was satisfied with their responses.

The next step in our plan is to present this message at the **Voter's Meeting this week on Tuesday, April 17 at 7 p.m.** to share information and entertain discussion. It is felt that this is a very good opportunity for St. Peter's both from a community outreach perspective and from a facility use perspective. If you have any questions in advance of the Voter's Meeting, please contact us.
