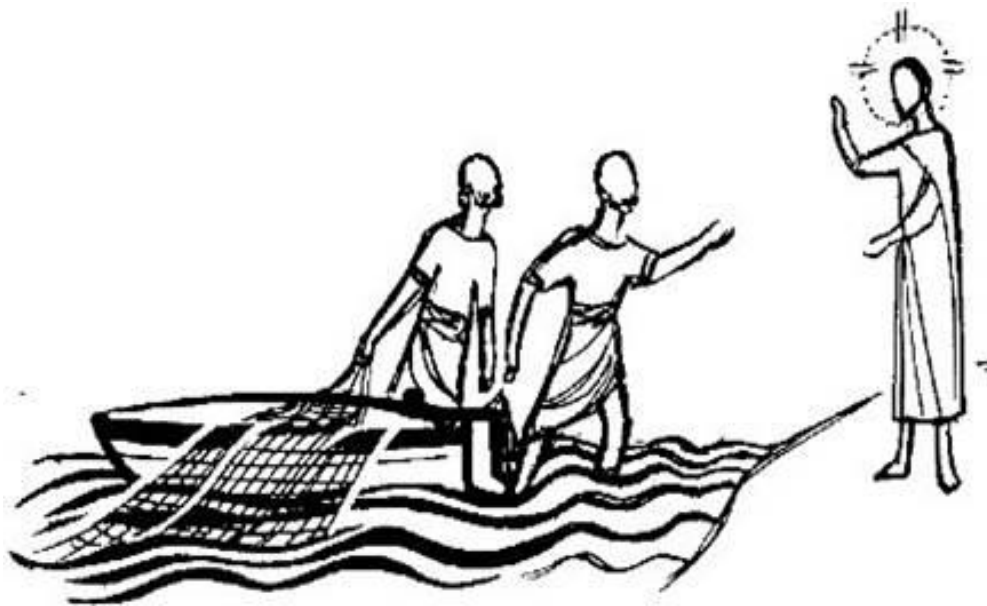

CONFESSION OF SINS

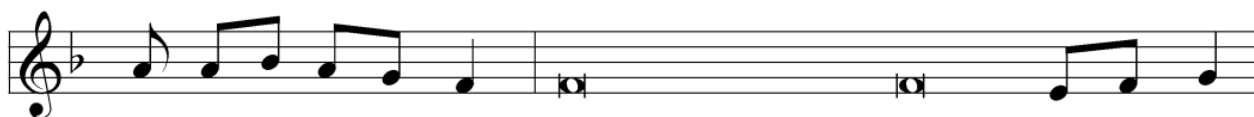

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

3 Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time, saying, ²“Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it the message that I tell you.” ³ So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, three days'

journey in breadth. ⁴ Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's journey. And he called out, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" ⁵ And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them. ¹⁰ When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster that he had said he would do to them, and he did not do it.

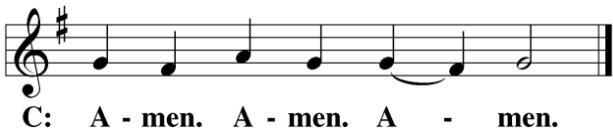

SUNDAY NIGHT BIBLE SERIES: JESUS—LORD OR LEGEND?

You are invited to attend Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Novi for a monthly series of eight presentations.

Jesus is one of the most written about and debated figures in the world. In this eight part series of videos (Dr. Paul Maier, noted historian at Western Michigan University) explores a three lane highway to the past through the disciplines of Archaeology, History and Geography. Along the journey, we look back to the world that Jesus himself saw as he moved toward the cross.

Format: View DVD segment, then discussion and questions and answers, led by Pastor Schroeder or Pastor Purdue.

First Session: February 11, 6:00 PM

A congregational meeting has been scheduled for TODAY Sunday, January 28 after church to discuss how best to use our resources in support of our congregation and the community. We encourage everyone to attend this important meeting.

St. Peter's is hosting the Southeast Michigan Pastor Teacher Conference on February 19th and 20th. This is a big task! We will need many helpers.
