On Sunday evening she and her husband Jeremy were summoned to Madison, Wisconsin. By Monday evening the double lung transplant was complete. There was a slight complication that required an additional surgery early this morning, but that process went well. Cassie is now recovering with the aid of medication and a temporary ventilator. So far the doctors are pleased with how her body has received her new lungs, however there are many challenges still ahead.
